We are a faith community smack dab in the middle of a vibrant downtown. We are neighbors with shop owners, restaurant workers, yoga instructors, and hair stylists. Every day hundreds and hundreds of people are walking up and down the streets that surround us.

How do we make Christ's love real in downtown Royal Oak?

How can we be a force for good?

This last week we saw how it works. Over 150 people gathered on our front lawn to watch the eclipse. Many of the people who gathered were new to our church, but they came to experience this moment with us. And, they came to shed a light on the hungry. By the time the day was over, hundreds of bags of groceries had been collected (thank you Randy Riggs and the Boy Scouts) and \$6,000 had been raised for Gleaners Food Bank.

Next weekend we will be in the middle of Arts, Beats and Eats, one of Metro Detroit's largest music and arts festivals. Half a million people will descend upon the area to enjoy the music, food, art and each other. And we will be right in the middle of it all!!!

We will also be having our Sunday worship as a part of the event. That's right - we will be on the Bud Light Country Stage for one worship service at 9:30 am.
